

Applicants that are selected for an interview should bring:

1. a DVD of their video work(s) (if available)
2. an Art Portfolio, or actual artworks they've made including: drawings, paintings, photographs, doodles, etc.
3. a Resume (if available)
4. completed "Paper Bag" Application Assignment (please see the guidelines)

Paper Bag Application Assignment

Make an original artwork using only a paper bag as your material.

Guidelines:

- The paper bag can be a lunch or supermarket size, but you may only use one.
- Additionally, you may use glue and/or tape to hold your piece together, if necessary. (Tape and /or glue may even become part of your form.)
- The object of the assignment is to transform an everyday object into something new and unexpected.
- Consider the types of tools you can use: scissors, Exacto blades, your hands, rulers, hole punchers, even water!
- This artwork can be 2-Deminsional or 3-Demnsional. However, you may NOT apply colors or use pencil etc. to draw on the bag, so it may be best create something that is unlike a picture.
- Your artwork must be an original abstract creation, not a representational form, such as: a person, dog, house, plane, etc.
- Many contemporary artists are well known for using everyday inexpensive materials to make art. Tom Friedman's sculptures are a good example of this.
- Hint: instead of trying to come up with your idea before you start "**PLAY**" with another bag to get ideas. Good Luck!
